The Corridor Communities Golf Outing presented by UPMC is a result of three local organizations working together to promote the business and economic growth of our communities. Proceeds from the event enable these organizations to continue their work supporting our local neighborhoods. Though each group has its own mission, their combined efforts and support is evident through community development, annual student educational grants, and participation at annual events.



### Economic Development South

The funds raised from this event are directly reinvested into Economic Development South (EDS.) EDS's core mission is to facilitate investment and reinvestment, create jobs, and enhance the competitiveness of our communities and corridors. EDS engages in activities and initiatives that reinforce and revitalize local commercial districts, while encouraging long-term, sustainable investment in our neighborhoods. EDS also pursues regional transportation, planning, and economic development policies and programs that help to further the mission, while working across municipal lines to encourage multi-municipal cooperation to address shared issues and concerns. Since 2011, EDS has raised nearly \$17 million for projects and initiatives in our communities! But this was only possible because of the incredible cooperation and collaboration of our member communities. Our member neighborhoods have contributed to EDS both financially (through annual contributions to support our operations) and through countless hours of service to our board and committees. Member communities include the Allegheny County boroughs of Brentwood, Baldwin, Whitehall, Mt. Oliver, Jefferson Hills, Pleasant Hills, Bethel Park, the City of Clairton; and the City of Pittsburgh neighborhoods of Carrick, Overbrook, Knoxville, and Brookline. EDS is most pleased to provide a return on that investment. In fact, for every dollar contributed to EDS, almost \$16 in grant funds was raised.



### Brentwood Baldwin Whitehall Chamber of Commerce

The Brentwood Baldwin Whitehall (BBW) Chamber of Commerce was formed in 1959 and currently has over 160 members serving our South Hills area.
